

**CALL FOR PAPERS IN PREPARATION FOR THE SOCCULT MEETING  
DUBLIN – NOVEMBER 26 & 27, 2007**

The last Scientific Committee held in March 2007 made provision for a meeting to be held by each Thematic Group during the present round of the Network activities. The 2007 SOCCULT Meeting on Social and Cultural Differentiation in European societies will therefore be held in Dublin, Ireland, on November 26 and 27 – all Monday and Tuesday morning. We cordially invite paper submissions for this Meeting.

There will be space for the research teams to meet. Nevertheless, the main part of the workshop is organised on the basis of a call for papers to all those interested in the future of social and cultural differentiation in European societies. Across research teams and specific projects, we would like to encourage submission of papers relevant to generational differences, ethnicity, immigration, cultural and lifestyle differentiation, social exclusion, class positions, status order, value systems, and more widely, to all forms of social differentiation, all ideas being most welcome.

In order to prepare the meeting programme, participants are invited to submit their proposals as soon as possible. We will subsequently upload the papers on the EQUALSOC website, in the SOCCULT section.
